Hand Cleaning Members are reminded on a regular basis to wash their hands with gel sanitiser. Especially before and after entering the water. Members are also reminded to catch coughs and sneezes in tissues – Follow Catch it, Bin it, Kill it and to avoid touching your face, eyes, nose or mouth with unclean hands. 			Cleaning Shared Equipment Boats and paddles are to be cleaned down with fresh water after removal from the container and after use. Gloves must be used when moving boats to and from the container. Wet suits, Buoyancy aids, Cags and helmets are to be loaned to members on a temporary basis. The members are responsible for cleaning the equipment and maintaining it. This equipment is to be used on the lake only and is not to be used on rivers. Boats and paddles are to be stored in the container after use and not used again for a minimum of 72 Hr's.

Reduce the amount of people accessing the boat house/premises for boats and	All lake sessions are to be controlled through a booking system on the clubs Facebook site.	Members	March 2021	
equipment, comply with the 2-metre (6.5 foot) gap recommended by the Public Health Agency.	Each lake session is to be limited to a maximum of 5 novice paddlers plus one coach. Sessions are to start at 18:00 with a target of being on the water by 18:15.			
	Experienced paddlers who have all their own equipment may use the lake during the club session. This second session is to start at 18:30. Experienced paddlers must not operate in a group greater than 6.			
	Junior members who are not able to carry their equipment are to be supported by parents / Guardians. These family groups are responsible for moving the equipment and supporting launching and landing of boats.			
	No members are to go onto the lake until the coach tells them it is safe to do so.			
	The coach will coordinate the launch / landing of the boats onto the lake.			
	Only one boat / Paddler is to be on the beach at any one time Unless a family member is required for launch / landing. Once launched the paddler must move away from the launch area and find a space close to the beach where they can maintain social distancing without blocking the launch area for other members.

Reduce the potential for members breaching the 2 meter rule whilst preventing danger	No members are to practise wet exit or rolling on the lake.	Club Coach	March 2021	
from capsizing.	If a member capsizes their boat, they are responsible for their own rescue unless a family member is on the water, available and capable to support.			
	Junior members must have a parent / guardian on the side of the lake so they can support them and their equipment when they reach the edge of the water.			
	Should the capsized member be unable to swim to the side, as a last resort assistance in the form of swim lines can be used from other member's boats under the guidance of the coach. Swim lines must then be cleaned and not used again for 72 hrs.			
	All members <u>must follow</u> the instructions of the coach at all times.			
	First aid equipment will be available however the club member is responsible for their own treatment. Some guidance will be given on what to do.			
	Breach of any rules will result in the member not being allowed to attend further sessions. Severe breaches may result in suspension of membership.
