	Cleaning Frequently cleaning and disinfecting objects and surfaces that are touched regularly particularly in areas of high use such as door handles, light switches, reception area using appropriate cleaning products and methods.	Cleaning Shared Equipment Boats and paddles are to be cleaned down with fresh water after removal from the container and after use. Gloves must be used when moving boats to and from the container. Wet suits, Buoyancy aids, Cags and helmets are to be loaned to members on a temporary basis. The members are responsible for cleaning the equipment and maintaining it. Boats and paddles are to be stored in the container after use and not used again for a minimum of 72 Hr's.	Members	March 2021	V

	Reduce the amount of people accessing the boat house/premises for boats and equipment, comply with the 2-metre (6.5 foot) gap recommended by the Public Health Agency.	All river trips are to be controlled through a booking system on the clubs Facebook site. Junior members who are not able to carry their equipment are to be supported by parents / Guardians. These family groups are responsible for moving the equipment and supporting launching and landing of boats.	Members	March 2021	













Rescue Reduce the potential for members breaching the 2 meter rule whilst preventing danger from capsizing.	Groups should be split into bubbles of no more than 6 people including the coach /river leader. Groups will be split based on ability. Some higher level paddlers will be asked to lead a bubble under the guidance of the coach/ river leader. Rescue No members are to practise wet exit or rolling on the river. If a member capsizes their boat, they are responsible for their own rescue unless a family member is on the water, available and capable to support. Junior members must have a parent / guardian on the side of the lake so they can support them and their equipment when they reach the edge of the water. 	used from other member's boats under the guidance of the Coach/ river leader. Swim lines must then be cleaned and not used again for 72 hrs. All members must follow the instructions of the Coach/ river leader at all times. First aid equipment will be available however the club member is responsible for their own treatment. Some guidance will be given on what to do. Breach of any rules will result in the member not being allowed to attend further sessions. Severe breaches may result in suspension of membership.

HERE'S HOW

From Sept 14th

GUIDANCE UPDATES:

- Paddling can take place in groups of up to 6 people from a maximum of 2 households. (Under 12s from the two households do not count towards total)
- U12s do not need to physically distance.
- 12s and over must maintain 2m distance at all time unless organsied activity
- Download the Protect Scotland App
- All British Canoeing courses and some events/competitions can take place subject to COVID mitigating measures
- Read the full guidance before organising activity

- Organised Activity can take place in groups of up to 30 people providing:
- Activities are structured and managed
- COVID Officer appointed who has completed the free sportscotland elearning
- Written risk assessment with mitigating
- ▼ Conduct Screening and Test and Protect measures
- Madvanced bookings and registration
- Activities in line with SCA guidance
- During Organised Activity a 'field of play' bubble suspends the need to physically distance during activity
